Joel Scott-Halkes was ranked in the top ten in the UK in GCSE Art and Design. Bill Levene (Leaver 2008) was awarded a scholarship by Cardiff University's School of Earth and Ocean Sciences.
<b>Fencing</b>	At the Public Schools Championships, Noah Rogerson (3 <sup>rd</sup> Form) won the Boys Sabre competition, with William Hosking (2 <sup>nd</sup> Form) placed third and Tom Harvey (3 <sup>rd</sup> Form) 15 <sup>th</sup> ; Alice Maidwell-Smith (4ths) came 2 <sup>nd</sup> in two classes. Truro School won the Cornish Schools Team Fencing Championship. Noah Rogerson is Under 14 British Champion and most recently won the English Youth Championships; he is also in British Under 17 squad ranking 12 <sup>th</sup> . William Deary (1 <sup>st</sup> Form) won the Gold Medal in the England Under 11 Championships (British U12 Championships – Silver medal) and has a national U13 ranking of 4 <sup>th</sup> . Tobi Ogunbode (1 <sup>st</sup> Form) reached the British Under 14 Championships quarter finals. William Hosking (2 <sup>nd</sup> Form) reached the top 16 in the British Under 14 Championships and was 3 <sup>rd</sup> = in the British Youth Championships. Of 83 entries from Truro School, 62 won certificates placing them in the top 40% in the UK. In the Junior Challenge which involves 200,000 school pupils all over the UK, 73 of our 100 entries from Years 1-3 were placed in the top 40% and have been awarded certificates. James Dommett and Liam Ardagh (2 <sup>nd</sup> Form) were placed in the top 0.05% nationally (Question: how many is that?) and have won entry to the Junior Olympiad.
<b>Music</b>	Sam Foster has won a choral award to Oxford University. National Youth Orchestra – Harriet Hougham-Slade; National Youth Choir – Charlie Murray. Harriet won the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music <i>Hedy King Robinson Award</i> . Sam Eddy won the school's first Performer of the Year Competition. Ben Comeau won the piano recital class with overall highest piano mark at the Torbay Festival; he is one of two British students invited to Holland to give an organ recital in August. 7 services, 50 concerts and 4 performances of Mozart's Opera <i>The Magic Flute</i> were given this year, including the usual major events at the Hall for Cornwall, Truro Cathedral, Truro School Chapel, the New Gymnasium and the Burrell Theatre.
