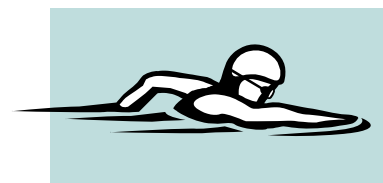
Well done to Year 5 swimmers who swam magnificently to produce exciting races with several new records.
