

The afternoon rugby match was well attended by parents, pupils and supporters.

On Saturday 10 September, the 1st XV played the annual opening match of the season against the Former Pupils. In front of a large crowd, the game proved to be very competitive and at half-time the school led 10-7 courtesy of a try by Sam Haywood and a conversion and penalty from impressive fly-half Will Hooper. Hugo Page scored a try from close range for the Former Pupils, converted by Matt Poole.

The 1st XV made six replacements during the second half and increased their lead through a superb solo effort by U16 player Troy Sixton, converted by Hooper who also landed another penalty. An excellent defensive effort in particular against older and bigger opponents laid the foundation for an impressive 20-7 win for the school.

Headmaster Andrew Gordon-Brown chats with Chris Rowe, TSFPA Committee Member



Coming from the Isles of Scilly, at the age of ten, to Treliske, and having had all the freedom a young boy could wish for, the discipline hit me forcibly. I got used to it very quickly and after a week or so, enjoyed the boarding life.

My main interest was not the academic side but sport, and very quickly I learnt to play a straight bat and bowl a length under the tuition of Mr. Stratton the Headmaster. I do remember one instance during wartime and the "Blackout", one boy decided to look out while the Air raid was in force. This was noticed by the Headmaster, who on knowing the culprit, took him on the landing and caned him.

I spent two years at Treliske and then over to the main school. The interest in the sporting side remained and before leaving in 1948 I had played in all the 1st teams ie. Cricket, Rugby and Soccer and in the final two years was Captain of School House at which time I accepted the Opie Shield on behalf of the house.




