

15 SEPTEMBER 2023: TRURO SCHOOL NEWS AND UPDATES



Dear Parents and Carers,

This week began with a Prep School assembly focusing upon the Truro School motto, *Esse Quam Videri*; 'To be and not to seem to be'. It gave us the opportunity to focus on the theme of integrity and, later, to explore how our actions implicitly affect how we are perceived by others. Of course, we did not use this terminology but rather some more child-centred vocabulary, finishing of course, by continuing with the quote, "We are free to choose but not from the consequences of our choices". Assemblies in the Pre-Prep have followed the same topic, albeit in a rather different format, and we will return to this theme regularly throughout the term.

Away from the assembly halls, the children have been in fine fettle, and they have tackled the myriad of lessons and activities with gusto. In addition to the regular academic and co-curricular timetables, this week has seen, amongst other things, Year 5 heading to Bodmin Moor for a day of walking, Year 6 completing their time trials in the pool at the Sir Ben Ainslie Sports Centre and Year 2 welcoming a litter of puppies into the classroom. Never let it be said that we lack breadth! The main emphasis of my message this week focuses not on the children but on you as parents and, in particular, our communication with you. I hope that the new format of the Bulletin (including links to year group-specific information) is helpful. Your feedback on this and on all school-based matters is much appreciated.

With regard to any routine, academic or co-curricular questions that you may have, your child's Form Tutor/Class Teacher should always be the first port of call. However, as they move into the Prep School, we quickly move away from class-based teaching to subject-specific lessons. Running in the Dining Hall from 8.45, these are a great opportunity for old and new faces to meet for an informal catch-up.


There will also be a uniform sale at each event. If you have any uniform that no longer fits and you would like to donate it to the school, please bring it to the School Reception.
