Safeguarding Focus

Online Safety and Messaging

As well as being Children's Mental Health Week, this week also marked Safer Internet Day on Tuesday 6 February, which has seen tutor groups across the School build on the work already done in PSHEE lessons, thinking about online safety and the law, discussions around how to protect themselves online and discussions around the impact of online unkindness and bullying on young people.



There is, of course, a wider debate in society about the impact of social media on young people. Most recently this has been given prominence through the advocacy of Esther Ghey, and the tragic death of her daughter Brianna. Her mother has argued powerfully for social media and certain apps to be banned for children under 16. Monitoring and managing children's access to and behaviour on social media is a challenge both for parents and educators.

To help with conversations and provide guidance at home, the Safeguarding Team thought it would be helpful to highlight some general points of advice and signpost to some helpful resources on <u>staying safe</u> on social media (NSPCC).

In our PSHEE lessons we focus on pupils being aware of the four C's of online safety. These are also helpful areas for parents to think about when considering how safe your child is online.

CONTENT – anything posted online, this might be words, images or video. Keeping an eye on what young people are seeing when online whether this is pornography, fake news, racism, misogyny, suicide, anti-Semitism, radicalisation and extremism.

CONTACT – this focuses on managing risk and staying safe from other users online. This might be peer pressure from other young people or adults posing as children. The NSPCC has useful information here about recognising the signs of grooming.

CONDUCT – we teach pupils in PSHEE lessons that how they behave online matters. Choice of language, using social media to be positive rather than negative about others and the fact that cyberbullying is unacceptable. Cyberbullying is one form of bullying as defined in our Anti-Bullying Policy and we encourage any pupil who experiences this or witnesses this to report it. Conduct online also involves things like sharing or receiving nudes and seminude images. Again, guidance from the NSPCC can be found here.

COMMERCE – there are also risks to young people from online gambling, phishing or financial scams.

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Ripples of Kindness

The whole school assembly focused on the theme of spreading kindness; drawing inspiration from the podcast 'Don't Tell Me the Score', Mr Murphy emphasised the ripple effect of kindness, comparing it to the way a pebble creates ripples in a pond. He highlighted how we can all find inspiration to be kind from those around us.

Using the concept of the 'R' effect, something we all became familiar with during the Covid pandemic and relating to the spread of diseases, recent studies conducted by Yale and Harvard Universities revealed that the 'R' rate of happiness has a rating of four or five. This means kind words or gestures we give towards one person can positively impact the following five people we interact with, and so on. Therefore, a single act of kindness among three people can potentially reach up to 125 people, equating to almost an entire form or workplace. Mr Murphy asked everyone to reflect on this and to practice spreading kindness in our daily interactions.

Thank you to our senior prefect team for the school news updates and notices, and congratulations to all the Values Award winners who have been noted for their exceptional acts of kindness.

3rd Year Environmental Insights

During a recent excursion to the Kenwyn River, 3rd Year geography pupils had the opportunity to apply their classroom knowledge in a practical setting. Over two days, all 3rd Years participated in their river studies at three different locations along the Kenwyn.

Pupils measured the width and depth of a river transect and used an orange to gauge velocity, showcasing impressive dexterity to prevent the fruit from being swept away by swifter currents. This process was repeated at two additional sites, followed by thorough evaluation and analysis to draw meaningful conclusions from their observations.

These hands-on experiences serve as invaluable supplements to classroom learning, fostering a deeper understanding of the subject matter. A huge thank you to our Head of Geography, Mrs. Wormald, and the dedicated staff whose efforts made this enriching experience possible.
