

8 MARCH 2024: TRURO SCHOOL NEWS AND UPDATES



Dear Parents and Carers,

As I hope you are aware, we have, throughout this academic year, focused on a number of topics both in and out of the classroom. I have written before (and will do again) on the topic of metacognition and those who have read my ramblings in recent weeks will know that we have also delved into table manners, common courtesies, and random acts of kindness.

Running parallel to all of this, and intertwined wherever possible, is the somewhat Victorian value of service; of doing something for others and for putting the interests of others above our own.

There is much evidence to suggest that service results in a stronger sense of purpose and meaning in life, as well as promoting improved mental and physical well-being. Hot on the heels of this came World Book Day and a chance to appear as one's favourite literary character, but also, the opportunity to bring in a favourite book and share it with someone else. Moving forward to today, we mark International Women's Day and take another chance to explore how we can all work to contribute to a world that is free of bias, stereotypes and discrimination.

Continuing into the weekend, tomorrow, Saturday, is the Truro School Prep Open Day which will see us welcoming over 60 families to Treliske House. It will be the perfect opportunity to welcome our visitors and to show them our splendid school.

Finally, and saving the best till last, Sunday is, of course, Mother's Day. I hope that the Truro School Prep children will thank not only their mothers but all their families for all that they do for them.


