Dear Parents, Carers and Guardians

Whilst literature takes a grip over the School and forms are taking part in the 'decorate your door challenge', Staff came together on Thursday break time in the newly refurbished library. They discussed books to discuss books and put their recommendations for pupils onto the reading tree that was built by our own DT department. My choice was Terry Pratchett, as I'm currently re-reading the books with my daughter and enjoying introducing her to the Discworld novels. I am also a long-

term subscriber to the boots theory - "A man who could afford fifty dollars had a pair of boots that'd still be keeping his feet dry in ten years, while the poor man who could only afford cheap boots would have spent a hundred dollars on boots in the same time and would still have wet feet." This week has seen the publication of the national schools' A-Level results tables by the DfE, and I am very pleased to be able to share that Truro School is the Number 1 A-Level ranking school in Cornwall. I'd like to say a tremendous well done to all of the students, staff and families for their hard work and excellent results in bringing about such a positive conclusion to their time here at Truro School. Of course, raw results only tell part of the story, and our continued success at finding pathways that an fit individual's ambitions and aspirations is remarkable.

In other updates, I attended the Cornwall Chamber of Commerce Big Breakfast this week as we are scheduled to host the annual Business Conference here at Truro School in July this year. This will be a really good opportunity for us to provide networking opportunities and support to Cornish businesses and employers. At the Big Breakfast, there were some good presentations including an update for the opening in June of the new A30. I'm sure we are all looking forward to this significant milestone in the transport infrastructure for Cornwall, and if the aim is for June, we will aim for an even more predictable transport service for the next academic year. We continue to review our more local transport arrangements, and I must ask for all of your assistance around the School for drop-offs and collections so we minimise disruption to our neighbours where we can – thank you for your support in this area. We continue to work with Truro City Council to input suggestions and plans for improvements. In terms of our wider transport service, our Vectare booking service is fully up and running and is available for both regular and flexible bookings as you may need. Since my last bulletin where I provided some of the financial payment options and support that the School provides, I wanted to say that we are continuing to work hard on our financial sustainability, and at this time of year, we look forward to the budgeting cycle. We will also keep you updated as and when aware of any significant changes locally or nationally that affect you or us, including as a result of factors within or beyond the School's ability to control. Lockdown Practice - Warning

Every School has to have procedures in place to protect pupils and staff from incidents on the school grounds. Most familiar is a fire drill where we manage careful exit from buildings. A different scenario is a Lockdown and next week we will be practicing our Lockdown procedures. We will be focussing on introducing the concept of Lockdown to pupils who have joined school since the last rehearsal and refreshing those pupils who were here on what action they will need to take in the event of a Lockdown as opposed to actually practicing it. We have scheduled it for during lesson time so that the majority of pupils and staff will be inside buildings, which will reduce confusion and the impact on any lessons.

All pupils will receive advance warning on Monday of the practice that will happen later in the week, which will include how it is going to be notified and what to do if they are not in a building. We will be playing pre-recorded messages over the School Bell system, which will make it very clear that it is a test.

The majority of buildings in the school now have access control installed so it is really important that all pupils have the ability to get into a building. We are aware that currently some pupils do not bring their band to school. Please therefore remind your child/children to bring their band to school. If they have lost it they need to go the Front Office to get a new one.

We would like to stress that this is not in response to any threat towards Truro School and we will be making this very clear to all our pupils too. It is just a practice that we have not done for a while. We will have members of staff located around the school to act as observers and they will assist any pupils who are outside when it is activated.

We hope that with this awareness is of reassurance to you and your children about the week ahead and the steps the School takes to promote ongoing safety on site. If your child has any concerns or questions, please direct them to their Form Tutor who will be happy to help.

Pupils, who may have joined the school part way through the 1st – 2nd Year, who have made an outstanding contribution and demonstrated the criteria described above, may also be awarded Junior Colours, as decided by the department leader.

Middle Colours



Awarded to 5th Year pupils

Covering commitment across the 3rd, 4th & 5th Year

Middle Colours: Silver Lapel Badge

These should be awarded towards the end of the appropriate term in the 5th Year and should be in recognition of:

- Sustained commitment, displaying loyalty and dedication
- The attainment of dedication to performance throughout the 3rd, 4th & 5th Year
 - A positive attitude to playing and performing, as requested
- A positive role model and being an ambassador for Truro School

Pupils, who may have joined the school part way through the 4th – 5th Year, who have made an outstanding contribution and demonstrated the criteria described above, may also be awarded Middle School Colours, as decided by the department leader.

Awarded to Upper Sixth Students

Covering commitment across the Lower Sixth & Upper Sixth

Senior Colours: Gold Lapel Badge

These should be awarded towards the end of the appropriate term in the Upper Sixth and should be in recognition of:
