
EPQ Showcase

Our audience was in for a real treat this week, as they enjoyed the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) Showcase evening. The EPQ is an established A-Level programme that equips students with a range of professional, academic and personal skills.

From researching to referencing; discussing to creating; each student's project is a unique venture into a personalised area of interest. Students select one project from an option of four (artefact, dissertation, investigation and performance) and delve into a defined area of enquiry. After completing their projects, they are required to present their work to a non-specialist audience, where they present their work before taking questions from the audience on their subject. This year we enjoyed topics including creating a fragrance, looking at whether the U.S. drug policy should be reformed, and if psychology is a limiting factor of space exploration.



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Physics - Global Communications

The WAA Physics Club recently visited the PK Porthcurno Museum of Global Communications to learn about the history of the Cable & Wireless Company and its pivotal role in revolutionising global communications.

Throughout the tour, pupils engaged with interactive displays that brought to life the physics principles they had been studying in the classroom.

Through hands-on demonstrations and insightful explanations, the pupils developed an appreciation for the electromagnetic devices that transmit signals worldwide and the advancements that have shaped the modern world of telecommunications.

Eggs for Our Ostereierbaum

1st and 2nd Years have been getting creative in their German lessons to create two beautiful Ostereierbaum, or German Easter trees. A much loved German Easter tradition, the Ostereierbaum is made from a few young branches of spring blossom trees placed in a vase or container. The branches are then decorated with wooden or blown-out egg ornaments.

Our pupils have been carefully decorating their delicate blown eggs in German lessons. Once dried, these colourful creations have been hung on the 'trees' along with silken ribbons and garlands. The trees can be seen in the Senior School Reception and Chapel. Thanks to Mrs Srikanthan and the gardening team for their work in getting these beautiful decorations made.

We sincerely thank Dr Vardy for inspiring us with his expertise and passion for these subjects, leaving us with a much deeper understanding of these subjects and a curiosity to learn more.



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Pupils Join Design Workshop

4th and 5th Year pupils interested in pursuing careers in architecture and design were invited to a meeting with the Senior School Leadership Team (SSLT) and Tate and Co. the architectural team behind the new music project.

During the workshop, pupils engaged in detailed discussions on various elements, including flooring, wall finishes, acoustic requirements, and lighting considerations. The team from Tate and Co. provided insights into a selection of materials to achieve the desired sound quality, sustainability goals and budget. Additionally, they explored specific lighting ideas to enhance visual effects and performance, ensuring that the new space meets the diverse needs of the School users.





UCAS Discovery Day

Lower Sixth attended the UCAS Discovery Event at Westpoint Arena in Exeter. The event featured over 100 university stands, allowing students to engage in one-on-one discussions with representatives from various universities. Additionally, seminars and interactive "course try" sessions were available, offering insights on university applications and showcasing a diverse range of undergraduate courses, including opportunities in Armed Forces, game design, traditional programs, apprenticeships, and degree apprenticeships.

This event is a key component of the post-18 pathway support program, which becomes more intensive in the spring term and culminates in post-18 options days in June. To assist students in their research and application processes, they participate in fortnightly diploma sessions focused on their applications, understanding student finance, transitioning to independent living, securing student accommodation, and other relevant topics.

International Boarding Agents

We were delighted to welcome thirteen international boarding agents to our school, representing a diverse range of countries, including China, Italy, Bulgaria, Romania, Taiwan, Germany, Turkey, Switzerland and Ukraine. Throughout their visit, our guests had the chance to immerse themselves in various aspects of school life. 


