Head Lice

We have cases of head lice in school and would very much appreciate your help in trying to eradicate them. Please can you check your child's hair this evening if possible, using the wet comb method, to help us become lice free! Head lice are difficult to find in dry hair, but in wet hair they lose their grip, move more slowly and can be combed out. Regular combing will help to prevent re-infection as it damages the lice and breaks their life cycle.

To avoid using chemical applications, which are very bad for the environment, we recommend washing the hair, rinsing and applying a normal conditioner. Comb through the conditioner with an ordinary comb to remove the tangles. Then, using a head lice comb, part the hair into sections. Comb through, starting at the scalp and out to the end of the hair. After each stroke check the comb for lice and rinse or wipe the comb. After combing the entire head, rinse out the conditioner.

To try and limit the spread of head lice we would advise weekly wet-combing as above, maintain long hair in a ponytail or braids, avoid sharing combs/brushes and hair accessories and do not allow head-to-head contact.

Seasonal Bugs

Unfortunately, the usual bugs have started circulating already and many children are suffering from headaches, sore throats and tummy aches. If your child feels well enough to concentrate, then obviously we would very much prefer for them to come in to school. If, however, they feel too unwell or if they have a temperature then we would prefer they stay at home and rest up so they are fighting fit for their return! If your child is a bit under the weather and you would like to send in Calpol for administration whilst they are here, please feel free to hand it in to the Reception Office and they will give you a permission form to complete.

Can I also take this opportunity to stress the importance of ensuring your child brings in a named water bottle every day, so we can encourage them to stay hydrated, thus helping maintain a good immune system.


