Dear Parents, Guardians and Carers,

It has been a pleasure reflecting on the past week as we celebrated the European Day of Languages. Throughout this week, our students and staff came together to celebrate linguistic diversity, foster cultural understanding, and promote the importance of language learning.

This week not only celebrated the diversity of languages within Europe but also emphasised the broader benefits of language learning. Learning a new language fosters cognitive development, and promotes empathy and intercultural understanding.

In Chapel, Rev Helen and Mr Vanstone encouraged pupils to use their language skills to greet their peers. Pupils from 3rd Year and Sixth Form recited the Lord's Prayer in French, Spanish and, beyond Europe, Cantonese. This was followed by the hymn, "Here I am Lord" where we were encouraged to sing the chorus in French, German and Spanish.

Throughout the week, pupils have also enjoyed participating in many activities such as international culture quizzes and, in a lunchtime club, a game called 'Back to Madrid' that helps revise and improve sentence structures.

The literal 'flavour' of language was also evident in our dining room this week where pupils and staff tucked into European dishes including coq au vin, bigos stew, sauerkraut, risotto and schnitzel. My heartfelt gratitude goes to all staff and pupils involved.

As ever, elsewhere, our community has continued to be very busy with exciting educational curriculum visits including 5th Year Geography and Geology fieldwork at Boscastle and Upton Cross respectively, and 1st Year Religious Studies trip to the Eden project. Well done also to our GCSE music solo performers for their excellent concert in the Chapel on Monday evening.

This Sunday sees Rev Helen presiding over our Chapel Anniversary Service, which this year, is celebrating the 96th anniversary of the opening of our beloved School Chapel. The service begins at 12pm and there will be refreshments afterwards. In the words of the Marty Haugen hymn, 'All are welcome' and I look forward to seeing some of you there.

Finally, it seems appropriate to sign off in the spirit of European languages week.

Truro School Receives Healthy Cornwall Award



Chloroplast Decolourisation Experiments

The Upper Sixth Form students conducted a Biology practical in the lab as part of their A-Level requirements. The objective of the experiment was to examine the effect of ammonium hydroxide on the decolourisation time of chloroplasts using DCPIP. The DCPIP goes from blue to colourless when it accepts electrons released by the chlorophyll. All three teams were pleased to report their experiments were successful and will be going away to analyse their data and draw their conclusions.



News from the Heseltine Gallery

EXPRESSIONS OF AN INTIMATE ECOLOGY PETE WARD 2023 We would be delighted for you to join us at the exclusive private viewing of Pete Ward's retrospective show on October 19th 5-8pm at The Heseltine Gallery.

For the last 17 years Peter Ward has been at the forefront of earth pigment research and painting in the UK. His journey began in North Devon, looking into the locally significant pigment Bideford Black and has since expanded, including contributions to national and international exhibitions, projects, and publications.

This exhibition brings together all aspects Peter's expansive interdisciplinary creative practice with hand foraged and processed earth pigments from Devon and Cornwall for the first time. Peter is currently based in West Penwith, Cornwall.

As a part of this exciting exhibition at The Heseltine Gallery, Pete Ward has been working with A-Level students from Truro School on their Cape Cornwall Artists Residential. Both Pete and students have also selected art works form the infamous Heseltine Collection as a part of this show, expressing their own responses to exploring the contemporary Cornish landscape.


Pete Ward is also offering a variety of explorative public talks and workshops during his exhibition: Pete Ward Earth Pigments Workshop Saturday 21 October 10-4pm. The workshop will offer practical insights into Peter's art making process with earth pigments from Cornwall and North Devon, including hands-on pigment processing and paint-making demonstrations with a range of traditional binders (gum Arabic, egg, linseed/poppy oil and acrylic medium) and their geological and social history, alongside space to reflect upon the ecological relevance of making with foraged materials.


