They will further develop their higher order reading skills-especially inference and prediction. Through studying the texts, they will also have a greater understanding of the author's craft, sentence construction, text structure, composition and effect. Drawing on this knowledge, they will then look at other short stories e.g. 'Bloddon's Adventure' and use these to further develop how to plan for effective narrative writing and build effective narrative features e.g. sensory descriptions to create atmosphere. Pupils will write their own narratives and improve their editing skills in preparation for Key Stage 3. SPaG and Independent reading will continue to be taught in the same way.
