Dear Parents and Carers,

I am delighted to have the opportunity to communicate with you via this Bulletin. As the Designated Safeguarding Lead at Truro School Prep I would like to highlight a few things this week regarding the safety and wellbeing of your children.

1. End of the day pick up

This term we have reviewed and reminded the children of our end of day procedures within the Prep School. At morning registration, the children state what they expect to be doing at the end of the day. At the end of the day, those going home at normal time are asked to 'sign out' with their designated teacher (usually form teacher). Our clubs' registers are then called ensuring that any cross overs are accounted for.

We know that there are several families and friends who wisely participate in regular car sharing and we encourage and support this. To ensure the safety of your children we would like to update our 'agreed pick up' list. If you have already contacted the office this term to alert them of named people who you agree to meet your child(ren) then there is no need for further action. However, if you intend to use regular alternatives to yourselves could you please let our office staff know of names and contact details via email prepoffice@truorschool.com? If you use an alternative pick up as a 'one off', this information will also need to be passed to the office via email.

2. Driving into the school drive

Unfortunately, it has once again been brought to our attention that a car has been observed taking a right turn into the school drive from the west bound direction of Tresawles Road. This not only took another driver by surprise but also a pedestrian who did not expect cars to be coming from behind them. We cannot stress enough that you should not be using this this short cut, we would rather your child arrives safely and a couple of minutes later than any other alternative.

3. Family wellbeing

Covid guidance

We thought it would be useful to update you on our School's approach to Covid. As you know, it is not a legal requirement for your child to take a Covid-19 rapid lateral flow test or to self-isolate if they have Covid symptoms. However, we support a common-sense approach should your child feel poorly. If they feel well, they can attend school. If your child feels unwell or has a high temperature (38° or above) they should stay at home. If your child does have a positive Covid test, they should try to remain at home for 3 days after the day they took the test. The NHS has also produced generic guidance for parents: Is my child too ill for school?

Measles / MMR vaccination

The NHS are asking education settings to share some back-to-school messages about MMR / measles and how to get vaccinated. The first dose of the MMR vaccination is offered when a child is 1 year old and the second at 3 years and 4 months old. This provides long lasting protection against measles, mumps and rubella. If your child has missed their first or second dose of the MMR vaccine, or if you are unsure if your child is due a vaccination, check their red book or contact your GP practice to discuss further. 




