Dear Parents, Guardians and Carers,

As we welcomed in October this week, in Chapel pupils have been introduced to autumnal themed hymns in preparation for our Harvest Festival. Thanks to Mr Osmond, Director of Music, for inspiring us all to sing with confidence (and hopefully in tune!). Next week Rev'd Helen will lead services of thanks for all we have and give encouragement and inspiration for all we can do to support the lives of others. At the end of next week, we have our first charity day of the new academic year. We will be supporting the Methodist action charity, All We Can, and collecting for the Truro

Across our school community we are commemorating Black History Month; an event that shines a light on the historical and contemporary contribution of black Britons. This year's commemoration 'Saluting out Sisters' highlights the role black women have played in shaping history and championing change. At our Sixth Form Diploma lecture 'A History of Prejudice (knowledge is power)', Dr Charlie Easmon gave a thought-provoking talk on the recent and historical events that drive inequality. Drawing on his own education and medical training, Dr Easmon shared his passion for using education as a tool to bring about positive change in the world. This month we will encourage our pupils to reflect on the stories of amazing black women who have demonstrated great courage and determination to overcome oppression and give people a voice.

Supporting personal growth remains at the heart of our pupils' educational journey. This half term Mr Copeland and I have visited 5th Year lessons to talk to pupils about their learning, and to strengthen our understanding of both the successes and challenges experienced so that we can continue to offer the very best support for our pupils. I'm quite certain Mr Copeland's highlight was taking part in a physics experiment to test reaction time (I cannot possibly comment on Mr Copeland's reaction time other than to say it was not quick!), and for me, it was listening to our 5th Years analyse a poem written by the great Maya Angelou: the articulation with which pupils expressed the poetic themes of the work as well as the techniques employed, was quite astounding. Our whole school focus on metacognition is promoting individual pupil independence in learning and we could not be prouder of the strong learning behaviours demonstrated by our pupils. This half term, all pupils will receive a learning score: a reflection of learning behaviour (effort) over time.

This Saturday is Open Morning, a highly anticipated day in our school calendar where we look forward to welcoming new families, as well as saying hello to existing members of our community. My thanks to all involved in making this an exciting and informative event.

In this month of hope, inspiration and empowerment, I will leave you with the words of Maya Angelou 'Courage is the most important of all the virtues because without courage, you can't practice any other virtue consistently'.

I hope you and your family enjoy the sunny weekend ahead.

What an action-packed start to term; clubs and fixtures are in full swing. Whilst the majority of our adults and pupils in the Truro School Community are familiar with what we do in the sports department, there are plenty of newcomers, across all year groups, who will no doubt be mesmerised by all that is on offer. Added to this is the evolving nature of our school and I thought I would share some tips and updates, that will help all the community navigate through the busy world of sporting life at Truro School.

SPORTS CLUBS AND ACTIVITIES

These can be found both on Misocs and the co-curricular clubs and activities list, at the end of this bulletin. To attend sports clubs, pupils need to turn up and register with the person in charge; no advance booking is required, unless stipulated on the list.

MISOCS

Mrs Jobling has shared details on the last two bulletins about how to set up your account on Misocs.

For Sports fixtures, team sheets will only be emailed out to parents under the following circumstances:

- Out of hours fixtures on weekdays (e.g. a fixture that returns to school later than 6pm)
- Weekend fixtures
- Fixtures and tournaments that require pupils to miss the school day.

For all other fixtures, pupils will take responsibility and can check Misocs or the big screen in the entrance lobby of the SBA. Team captains will also help remind pupils of their involvement. Team sheets will be posted 48 hours before the fixture and we are always encouraging the pupils to be proactive in checking the team sheet and in reading the additional information that goes with it.

SPECTATORS ON SCHOOL SITE

If a fixture is taking place within school hours and you would like to support the team, please do remember to sign in at the SBA, before going to the fixture. This helps us keep a record of who is on site for fire alarm purposes, in addition to our safeguarding commitments.

FOOTWEAR

When taking part in physical activity or sport, the correct footwear is extremely important. Currently, we are seeing a rise in Nike Air Force 1/Vans, which offer little support for the midsole and ankle. Some pupils are also using these shoes as school shoes, which creates a hygiene issue, not to mention, very sweaty feet... Please do help us in encouraging pupils to select appropriate footwear and to bring socks for sport and to not use their school socks as well. RETURN TO PLAY

Following from Mr Murphy's letter and announcement of the return to play system, I would like to remind you that you can record a possible concussion or head injury from an activity and location. When you use the system, it alerts the med team and I, which allows us to provide the right care for our pupils and manage their recovery from a concussion. If you do receive an email from return to play, please do click the 'view injury details' tab, which will provide an overview of the incident. If the injury is more than a bang to the head or a little more serious than the average incident, a member of staff will also call home, to reassure and update on the pupil's status. The early feedback from those that have used the return to play system has been positive and if you do want to share your feedback with us, we would be very grateful.

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Saluting our Sisters – Black History Month

'Saluting Our Sisters' is the theme for Black History Month and this year, where we will be shining a spotlight on the incredible contributions of Black women throughout history. Throughout October, you will notice posters and displays in our School and Sixth Form Centre and Cafe, each introducing Black women who have achieved something remarkable in fields such as literature, science, leadership, and sports.

We encourage everyone to take a few moments to stop and read about these remarkable women featured on the posters and draw inspiration from them. Their tales are a testament to their hard work, innovation and ambitious dreams, something which we all aspire towards.



The History of Prejudice

Whilst we have been focusing on celebrating innovative Black women, we also welcomed the wonderful Dr Charlie Easmon, a medical doctor and civil rights activist, who delivered a thought-provoking talk on the History of Prejudice, giving students and staff the opportunity to reflect, think and question our own beliefs on this topic.

Exploring 'Our World' at Eden

Exploring 'Our World', our 1st Year pupils embarked on a trip to the Eden Project as part of their Religious Studies topic. They hunted for the Fibonacci sequence within the natural world, whilst rising to the challenge of finding innovative and positive solutions to address the climate crisis.





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Super Sedimentary Skills

Our Geology students have been stepping back 310 million years to work on their sedimentary rock knowledge. During a field trip to Upton Cross, these young geologists have been using their knowledge of sedimentary structures to interpret the fluctuating lake and fluvial environment where the rock has been deposited. They also work on their detailed descriptions of sandstone and shale.

This trip also serves as an excellent introduction to the next topic of their GCSE course, which focuses on rock deformation. Here, they also had the opportunity to practice field sketches of large-scale fold structures and develop their problem-solving skills by inferring the location of a strike-slip fault.

Field trips are an essential part of the GCSE and A-Level Geology course, and we are fortunate to have many world-class examples right here on our doorstep. Thank you to our enthusiastic geology department for organising these excursions.





Sunny Stratford for Sixth Form

The Upper Sixth trip to Stratford Upon Avon was a sunny treat. To complement the English Lit A-Level study of King Lear, the English department saw outstanding productions of Macbeth (a stunning bay, bagpipes, terrifying witches, a hilarious porter updated for the 21st century) and The Merchant of Venice, transposed to the East End of London during the 1930s rise of fascism and featuring a female Shylock. They secured a fascinating backstage tour of the Royal Shakespeare Theatre, learning lots of insider secrets, and a trip to see Shakespeare's grave and the medieval carvings that filled his imagination in Holy Trinity Church. Mrs Hood gave a talk on the presentation of women in the plays and students were asked to draw links with King Lear, tracing imagery of social and natural disorder, kingship, fathers and children and the role of the Fool.

A big thank you to Ms Selvey and the English department for organising such an inspiring visit.






EXPRESSIONS OF AN INTIMATE ECOLOGY PETE WARD 2023

We would be delighted for you to join us at the exclusive private viewing of Pete Ward's retrospective show on October 19 5-8pm at The Heseltine Gallery.

For the last 17 years Peter Ward has been at the forefront of earth pigment research and painting in the UK. His journey began in North Devon, looking into the locally significant pigment Bideford Black and has since expanded, including contributions to national and international exhibitions, projects, and publications.

This exhibition brings together all aspects Peter's expansive interdisciplinary creative practice with hand foraged and processed earth pigments from Devon and Cornwall for the first time. Peter is currently based in West Penwith. Cornwall.

As a part of this exciting exhibition at The Heseltine Gallery, Pete Ward has been working with A-Level students from Truro School on their Cape Cornwall Artists Residential. Both Pete and students have also selected art works form the infamous Heseltine Collection as a part of this show, expressing their own responses to exploring the contemporary Cornish landscape.



EARTH PIGMENTS WORKSHOP SATURDAY 21 OCTOBER

Pete Ward is also offering a variety of explorative public talks and workshops during his exhibition: Pete Ward Earth Pigments Workshop Saturday 21 October 10-4pm.

The workshop will offer practical insights into Peter's art making process with earth pigments from Cornwall and North Devon, including hands-on pigment processing and paint-making demonstrations with a range of traditional binders (gum Arabic, egg, linseed/poppy oil and acrylic medium) and their geological and social history, alongside space to reflect upon the ecological relevance of making with foraged materials.
