#### Dear Parents and Carers,

As I wrote earlier in the week, it has been an absolute pleasure to welcome your children back to school after the half-term break and to hear of their many adventures. #### **NOTICES**

#### 1) Uniform

A reminder that if you have been shopping for new uniform or belongings over the holidays, please could you ensure that every item is clearly named. I would also urge you to check through all of your child's belongings to make sure that any previous labelling is still visible, as often pen ink can become too feint to read or stickers can fall off. If you have acquired second hand uniform, please remember to replace the previous name with the new

It is always a shame to have so many items that can't be returned.

#### 2) Head Lice

We have cases of head lice in school and would very much appreciate your help in trying to eradicate them. Please can you check your child's hair this evening if possible, using the wet comb method outlined below. Head lice are difficult to find in dry hair, but in wet hair they lose their grip, move more slowly and can be combed out. Regular combing will help to prevent re-infection as it damages the lice and breaks their life cycle.

To avoid using chemical applications, which are very bad for the environment, we recommend washing the hair, rinsing and applying lots of normal conditioner. Comb through the conditioner with an ordinary comb to remove the tangles. Then, using a head lice comb, part the hair into sections. Comb through, starting at the scalp and out to the end of the hair. After each stroke check the comb for lice and rinse or wipe the comb. After combing the entire head, rinse out the conditioner.

To try and limit the spread of head lice we would advise weekly wet-combing as above, maintain long hair in a ponytail or braids, avoid sharing combs/brushes and hair accessories and head-to-head contact. Many thanks for your help with this.

#### 3) Impetigo

We are aware that impetigo is around at the moment. Please keep watch for any spots or sores on your child and, if you are unsure, get them checked out by a pharmacist/GP. It is contagious, but easily treatable with antibiotics. Children are welcome to attend school 48 hours after a course of antibiotics has been started. There was time to reflect on those currently experiencing conflict and prayers for peace. The Head Girl and Boy laid a wreath of poppies before The Last Post echoed across the school and the community engaged in a moment of quiet reflection. The children then 'planted' a pot of poppies to remember the fallen.
