Dear Parents and Carers,



After six weeks of competition and the longest final in history, I am delighted to inform you that Charlie eventually prevailed over Tilda and has been crowned the Truro School Prep Conker Competition Champion for 2023.

With this momentous news out of the way, I can now focus on the myriad of events that have taken place over the past five days. First and foremost, the academic focus has been on Prep School assessments. It is true to say that some of the children have surprised themselves in that they actually enjoyed the experience!

Outside of the classroom, the drama and music departments have been hives of activity as they prepare for the end of term and Christmas events; please be sure to check the Bulletin calendar carefully as such dates will soon be upon us.

This week has also been busy on the sporting front with all manner of fixtures and galas taking place. The undoubted highlight of the sporting calendar was Wednesday's rugby festival, hosted here at Treliske, which saw some 200 children in action and an equal number of spectators on the touchlines.

Messages from Prep First Aid

A couple of medical reminders, with various illnesses circulating.

1. Sickness/Diarrhoea

It is our policy that children must stay at home until a clear 48 hours have passed since the last episode of vomiting or diarrhoea. We would like to avoid the spread as much as possible, so appreciate your cooperation with this.

2. Colds, Coughs & Sore Throats

It's that time of year when most of us are fending off some sort of cold or sore throat. We encourage the children to come into school as long as they do not have a temperature and are well enough to concentrate. If you have given your child Calpol before they come in and would like us to administer a second dose during the school day, please pick up a permission form from the Reception Office or ask us to email one over to you. Any medicine dropped into us must be in its original packaging, named and handed in for the attention of Mrs Cameron (Medical Care Lead) please.

3. Water

A reminder that all children should bring in a named water bottle daily please. I have so many children sent to me with headaches who admit they have not drunk enough water, so I would really appreciate your ongoing help with stressing the importance of keeping hydrated to fend off the bugs!

The 90 children attending were split into eight groups, named after local beaches. They took part in three of the eight activities on offer which included seaweed printing in art, Cornish holidays gone wrong in drama, and a lesson inspired by the future of space travel in Cornwall with Physics.

After a morning of making new friends and challenging themselves to try new things, the Year 6 pupils had worked up an appetite. The catering department put on a delicious spread of Cornish-inspired foods featuring classic Cornish pasties, local sausages, and Cornish cupcakes.

The final activity of the day saw all the children come together for an afternoon of sport in a Pirates of Truro team game; working together in their groups the children tried to collect as much treasure as possible.

Curiosity in the Classroom

Curiosity is at the heart of learning, and with a wide range of subjects on offer pupils are always trying new things.

Year 5 have been testing out their creativity skills in ceramics, creating handmade butterflies adorned with colourful paints.

Meanwhile, our Year 6 class are currently enjoying learning the basics of German with Mrs Palmer. Languages are an important part of learning, with children having the opportunity to learn French, Spanish, and German from the Pre-Prep.
