17 NOVEMBER: TRURO SCHOOL NEWS AND UPDATES



#### Dear Parents, Guardians and Carers,

Starting with a colourful Odd Socks Day on Monday to gain the attention of the whole community, we have been marking Anti-Bullying Week with a range of sessions and reflections across the week. Anti-Bullying Week is a nationwide event that aims to raise awareness of bullying of young people, with an emphasis on prevention and effective responses to bullying.

We are committed to providing a caring, friendly and safe environment for all of our pupils so they can learn and grow up feeling welcomed, included and valued.

We want to create a school where every pupil has a genuine sense of belonging. This is the case for the vast majority of pupils here, but that doesn't stop us striving for it to be true for all. Clearly, bullying of any kind is unacceptable at Truro School and is not compatible with our School values. It remains the case, as always, that if bullying does occur, we hope that pupils feel able to tell someone in the knowledge that support and appropriate follow up action will be genuine.

In whole school assembly, I spoke this week about the key elements of enhancing our inclusive community to ensure there is an ever-greater sense of belonging, respect and togetherness. Pupils were encouraged to think about the positive chain reaction between "comfort, connection and contribution". Looking out for one another and helping each other to feel comfortable. Seeking out connections with others and working together. Both of these foster a community where each pupil's contributions are unleashed.

Each year group focused on different aspects of anti-bullying this week in pastoral tutorials. Sixth formers focused on the importance they have as role models to younger pupils and our Lower Sixth ACHE counsellors have begun their training ready to be able to mentor and be a point of contact for supporting younger pupils. In the Middle School, year groups focused on understanding when "banter" tips into unkindness as opposed to humour, which is mutually and equitably exchanged. In the Lower School, we saw the most enthusiastic odd sock wearing and pupils discussed how bullying can be defined and explored some fictional scenarios of pupil interactions.

We have also this week launched an online reporting form for pupils concerned about themselves or another pupil. Of course, pupils are still encouraged to talk to members of staff if they have any worries, but schools nationally are increasingly providing an online means for pupils to raise concerns with staff. Posters with a QR code are going up around the school site and will be sent to pupils as well, allowing them to report anything from a mental health concern or a worry about inappropriate behaviours between pupils, so that staff can follow up with them. Of course, anything reported by pupils via this route, as in person, will be followed up sensitively and supportively in line with our usual safeguarding and behaviour policies.

Your children are part of an overwhelmingly happy, ambitious and supportive School community, but as ever, if you have any concerns that you would like to share with us, please contact the relevant Head of Year or tutor in the first instance.

#### Fantastic Fieldwork Skills

Our Lower Sixth Geography students completed a three-day residential to Nettlecombe Court, gaining a range of valuable fieldwork experience including GIS flood risk mapping in Minehead, coastal processes in Porlock, urban regeneration in Watchet, and carbon capture in a local woodland.

The students also enjoyed evening tuition on GIS and the use of statistics which will prove very useful for their future studies in the classroom.

Mrs Wormald would like to share how proud she was of the students for their hard work throughout the trip. The students gained great confidence throughout, and it was fantastic to see the groups working together so brilliantly.



#### Carn Brea Fieldtrip

Last week our 4th Year geologists were out on Carn Brea for their first field trip of the GCSE course. They have spent the first half term looking at how to identify different rock types and the processes that form them. This was a great opportunity for them to put that knowledge into practice as they examined the granite outcrops. They were also introduced to a number of field techniques, including rock descriptions and recording their observations on field sketches, both of which are assessed in the GCSE C2 practical exam.

Finally, the group used the vantage point to discuss the formation of the valuable mineral deposits by hydrothermal processes which have been extracted for centuries in the towns and villages surrounding Carn Brea.




