

12 JANUARY 2024: TRURO SCHOOL NEWS AND UPDATES



Dear Parents and Carers,

A week of clear skies and dry weather has been an absolute treat and the sunshine has most definitely put a spring in everyone's step.

Further good news comes courtesy of the Met Office who suggest that, whilst we may not receive quite as much sunshine, we are set for a further spell of dry weather.

Mr Frewer, who we all know is finely attuned to the Cornish climatic conditions, informs me that, having read the tea leaves, there is a more than fair chance of snow during the early part of next week.

1) Colds, Hats & Water Bottles

It's that time of year when many of us are fending off some sort of cold or sore throat! We encourage the children to still come into school, as long as they do not have a temperature and are well enough to concentrate. If you have given your child Calpol before they come in and would like us to administer a second dose during the school day, please pick up a permission form from the Reception Office or ask us to email one over to you. Any medicine dropped into us must be in its original packaging, named and handed in for the attention of Mrs Cameron please.

In addition to their school coat, please could I suggest that you send your child in every day with a named warm hat to wear; ideally a Truro School beanie or at least a plain navy or black one. 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
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
