### Uniform List (Years 7 - 11)

Navy Truro School crest blazer

Kilt (Years 7/8) or skirt with four pleats (Years 9 - 11) in school tartan with navy tights or navy socks  
or

Medium-grey trousers in worsted flannel (or medium grey, tailored shorts) with plain grey socks

White short/long-sleeved collared shirt with school tie  
or

White short/long-sleeved revered collar blouse

Truro School v-neck jumper with stripe at neck

Formal, black, leather/faux leather shoes which can be polished (see below)

Pupils may wear an plain navy blue or plain black waterproof coat over their Blazer (optional)



### School Shoes (Years 7 - 11)

Black school shoes made from strong material like leather should be worn. They should be clean, smart and in a good state of repair. Shoes must be able to hold a polish. Trainer style shoes without a heel or canvas shoes are not allowed.

School shoes must be lace-up, buckle or slip-on rather than fastened with Velcro. Shoes must not have a prominent logo on the main body of the shoe. Please email [enquiries@truroschoo.com](mailto:enquiries@truroschoo.com) if you are unsure as to whether something is acceptable.

## GUIDELINES

### Uniform Guidelines (Years 7 - 11)

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*Wearing school uniform correctly is extremely important, as it reflects pupils' pride in being part of the school community.*

**Trousers/Shorts:** Trousers/shorts should be medium-grey in worsted flannel, formal and hold a crease. Jeans are not acceptable, nor are designs which are exceptionally skinny, baggy or worn very low on the hips.

**Kilts/Skirts:** The school kilt/skirt should be worn just above the knee and not shorter than 3 inches (7cm) above the knee.

**Socks or Tights:** Socks (visible above the shoe) or tights must be worn at all times.

- Grey socks should be worn with trousers and shorts.

- Navy tights or navy socks should be worn with Kilts/Skirts.

(White socks are not allowed outside of PE at any time of the year.)

**Shirts:** Shirts must be tucked in, buttoned at the neck and the tie tied properly. Coloured or other visible t-shirts may not be worn under shirts.

**Blazers:** Blazers must be worn to and from school, and during the working day, even under raincoats. During lessons staff may allow pupils to remove blazers while they are being taught, but they must put them on again to move about the school between lessons.

**Summer Uniform:** 'Summer Uniform' may only be worn when the Head announces it and the weather is appropriate. Summer Uniform allows pupils and Sixth Form students to come to school without a blazer or jacket. If they choose to wear one into school, it does not need to be worn around school. All other uniform rules still apply.

### Presentation Guidelines (Years 7 - 11)

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Pupils are expected to conform to the following guidelines on presentation. All staff are expected to let pupils know when they are not following our guidelines correctly.

**Hair:** Hair should be neat and presentable and only plain hair accessories may be worn. It is recommended for health and safety reasons that long hair is tied back.

**Make-up:** Years 7 to 9 are not allowed to wear makeup, and Year 10 and 11 are only permitted to wear natural looking make-up. Only clear nail-varnish is allowed.

**Piercings and Tattoos:** Any form of visible body-piercing or tattooing is not allowed, except that pupils may have pierced ears - see jewellery.

**Jewellery:** Pupils may not wear any visible jewellery other than one pair of small sleeper earrings or studs worn in the lobe of the ears.

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## Games and PE Kit Guidelines (Years 7 - 11)

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### Games Kit:

Pupils are split into 'girls' and 'boys' for games. \*Pupils are expected to wear school-specific sportswear linked to particular sports, such as games shirts, socks, boots, shin pads, and mouthguards where needed.

Pupils should always have trainers with them for all games lessons. This is in case we switch to wet-weather games or they move from the fields to the astro.

### PE Kit:

PE is taught in Tutor groups during timetabled PE lessons. It is more general and designed for a wider range of activities, including fitness, swimming, and multi-sport skills. It includes items like the PE shirt, shorts or skirt, white socks, trainers, and swimming kit.

## “Sick or fit bring your kit!”

If pupils are off Games or PE due to illness or injury, they should still bring their kit into school. The PE/Games team will modify what they are asked to do where appropriate and include them in the lesson within any necessary limitations.

The exception to this would be if they have an injury that means it is not practical for them to get changed.

## Bags and Stationery

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Pupils require bags for their school books and PE/Games kit. You may use any bags but most have rucksacks for your school books and kit bags for PE/Games which can go cross-shoulder. Any make and type can be used but the School Shop will be selling both which will be numbered and recorded to differentiate easily.

Pupils will need their own pencil case, including a selection of roller ball pens (or biro), a purple pen (to engage in feedback), pencils, rubber, ruler, highlighters.

All text books, exercise books and paper will be provided.

The Maths department will provide all pupils with a Scientific Calculator.
